Flower Specifications

Material

Discarded, clean, Tyvek® (white, flexible HDPE); a sterilization packaging material. **If printed, use non-visible side for flower.*

Craftsmanship

Size the flower between 2 to 4 inches in diameter. Thread is needed to sew together flower and if necessary a small amount of clear glue.

2. Intricate in Design
3. Creatively Expressive
